Membership in the RECI is open to all interested individuals within the electrical industry.

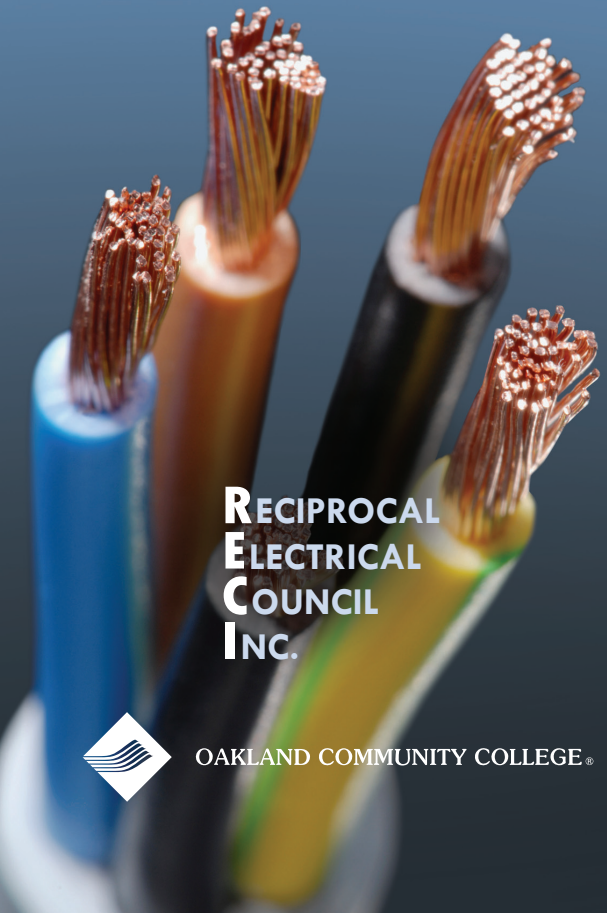
